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Primary Education with QTS at BGU

The three-year Primary Education course at BGU is designed to allow you to study a vocational honours degree in Primary Education leading to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS). It provides an integrated academic and professional preparation for teaching. If you believe that you can inspire children to learn and are passionate about the role that primary education plays in shaping a child's future, then this is the course for you.

Our course team will work with you to enhance and develop your understanding of learning and teaching. You'll spend a significant amount of time in school throughout the course, and will be encouraged and supported as you learn to develop effective ways to teach the whole primary

curriculum. You will explore the theory and practice of primary education and develop a personal philosophy that will underpin all that you seek to achieve with the children you teach.

Initially, you'll work with small groups of children, progressing on to working with a whole class, leading up to assessed school placements in your second and third years where you'll take full responsibility for whole classes of children.

Our course is organised into six strands: core subjects, foundation subjects, research, placement, critical thinking and professional skills to ensure you are well prepared to teach during each of the placements and to prepare you for your future career in the classroom.

Primary Education with QTS modules

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Year 1

Becoming A Teacher

In this module, you will develop your understanding of the role of a teacher and the professional attributes this requires. There will also be an introduction to professional skills (such as behaviour management, planning and assessment) and you will begin to consider how to adapt teaching to meet the needs of all learners, in particular those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

Learning To Learn

This module is designed to introduce you to theories of learning and to support you in learning to reflect with developing criticality, to support your own academic writing in other modules. This will enable you to develop new and enhance existing skills; providing opportunities to grow as a writer and researcher and allowing you to consider relevant seminal and current education practice.

Introductory Placement

A short school experience focussed on observation early in the year runs alongside university based sessions which will enable you to explore the importance of key aspects of teaching and learning in a professional setting with the support of other trainees. The Introductory Placement later in the year introduces you to planning and teaching and is normally a paired, 5 week school placement, with the addition of a preparation week also at the school. Additional school experiences are also included to broaden your understanding of the wide range of settings in which primary teachers work.

Child Development

This module focuses on issues of child development and the theories and research, both long-established and recent, which inform them. You will be supported in your ability to search for, read, understand and use academic literature in your written work.

Introducing The Foundation Subjects

You will be expected to develop subject knowledge alongside practical skills and positive attitudes, with regard to foundation subjects and religious education. You will develop a knowledge of planning and assessment, together with an understanding of how to apply a range of different teaching approaches.

Introducing The Core Subjects

This module will introduce you to the core subjects of the curriculum, focusing on both subject and pedagogical knowledge. On successful completion of this module you will be able to demonstrate knowledge of the underlying concepts and principles associated with teaching and learning in the core subjects, and evaluate the appropriateness of different approaches to developing concepts in the core subjects.

Primary Education with QTS

Year 2

School Placement

You will complete a solo school placement, usually of 6 weeks, in your chosen age phase, allowing you to develop your knowledge, understanding and application in that age phase, with the addition of a preparation week also at the school. Additional school experiences are also included to broaden your understanding of the wide range of settings in which primary teachers work.

Inclusive Practice

This module focuses on inclusive teaching and learning, in particular meeting the needs of pupils with Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities (SEND). You will enhance your knowledge of specific SEND, learning how to adapt your practice to promote the inclusion of all pupils (including considering the inclusion of pupils with English as an Additional Language and those with other identified needs).

Perspectives On Learning

You will build on your academic writing skills and will investigate a range of differing perspectives on learning. You will also have the opportunity to explore a variety of approaches to teaching, examining the effectiveness of each of these, as well as exploring relevant issues – for example, the use of social media as a teaching tool – and their impact in the classroom.

Beginning To Research

This module will introduce you to the processes of conducting your own research, including ethics and a range of methods commonly used in education. It will see you working together in groups with other students, supported by a tutor.

Global Education

During the study of this module you will build on your knowledge of foundation subjects and religious education, and consider global aspects of learning. You will explore a range of approaches to teaching and learning, considering different cultural contexts.

Planning For The Core

This module will further develop your subject and pedagogical knowledge in the core subjects. You will be expected to take responsibility for identifying and developing your needs, with a particular focus taken on different approaches to planning in the core.

Year 3

School Placement

Building on your second year placement, you will complete a solo school placement, usually of 7 weeks with a preparation week, in your chosen age phase, allowing you to extend your knowledge, understanding and application in that age phase. Additional school experiences are also included to broaden your understanding of the wide range of settings in which primary teachers work and prepare you for your NQT year.

Critical Thinking

In this module, you will explore aspects of critical thinking relating to current issues in education, such as obesity amongst younger children, as well as looking forward to future career directions. You will consider your wider role in the school environment and your transition from student to teacher, examining how this can be undertaken effectively.

Research Project

This module builds on previous experience with research and will see you conducting individual research projects in education. You will design your own study, formulating questions, choosing appropriate methods for the methodology, collecting and analysing data, and taking responsibility for ethical practice.

Directions In The Core

This module continues to develop your understanding of teaching and learning in the core subjects but expands to consider national and international perspectives, contemporary and alternative approaches. You will be expected to draw on what you have learned to articulate and justify your own beliefs about teaching and learning in the core.

Subject Leadership

This module will explore aspects of leadership in the primary school. These will be explored further in relation to individual subjects. Students will consider the role of a subject leader and how this can be undertaken effectively.

Delivery

There is no one-size-fits-all method of teaching at BGU – we shape our methods to suit each subject and each group, combining the best aspects of traditional university teaching with innovative techniques to promote student participation and interactivity.

You will be taught in a variety of ways, from lectures, tutorials and seminars, to practical workshops, coursework, work-based placements or even field visits. Small group seminars and workshops will provide you with an opportunity to review issues raised in lectures, and you will be expected to carry out independent study.

Placements are a key part of degree study at BGU. They provide an enriching learning experience for you to apply the

skills and knowledge you will gain from your course and, in doing so, give valuable real-world experience to boost your career.

Assessment

We recognise that individuals come from a wide range of backgrounds and experiences, so we use a variety of assessment strategies in our courses. These include presentations, essays, group discussions, and a research report. All of these individual assessments allow you to reflect on your practice and theory as you evidence your learning.

Support

Studying at BGU is a student-centred experience. Staff and students work together in a friendly and supportive atmosphere as part of an



intimate campus community. You will know every member of staff personally and feel confident approaching them for help and advice, and staff members will recognise you, not just by sight, but as an individual with unique talents and interests. We will be there to support you, personally and academically, from induction to graduation.





Modules

Professional Studies

In this module students will explore inclusion, with a particular focus on Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). It will also cover English as an Additional Language (EAL) and managing behaviour. Planning, assessment, organisation, working with others and the learning environment will also be introduced.

Curriculum

This module is designed to provide support for the development of subject specific knowledge and the interaction between areas of the curriculum, ensuring that the students are able to develop the skills and knowledge, linked to relevant and current practice.

The Researching Teacher

The students will design their own research in education, formulating questions, choosing appropriate methods for the methodology, collecting and analysing data, taking responsibility for ethical practice. The module requires the students to be intellectually curious and accept ambiguity.

Personalised Learning

This module supports students to identify their own needs in terms of subject knowledge, experience and skills. Initial subject audits and personal tutorials will develop a structure to support the personalised development of skills and knowledge through taught sessions, independent learning and school based tasks. Students will build on their initial starting points, regularly reflecting on progress and building a future plan for after completion of the programme.

Placement modules

The placement modules allow students to engage in assessed placements in local partnership schools. These contribute to both the award of the degree itself, and the recommendation for QTS.



Primary Teaching Studies with QTS

What we offer

Delivery

This course is aimed at teaching assistants working in primary schools. It allows you to combine your work in a school with study towards an honours degree. There is weekly attendance with sessions running from 1-8 pm on Thursdays.

You will examine the National Curriculum and other initiatives with a view to practical applications in the classroom. Specialist tutors from across the University are encouraged to contribute to distinct subject sessions and you are fully briefed on your professional role. This course ensures that theory is firmly anchored in practice. This is particularly relevant to the small-scale research project you will be asked to complete.

School placements are an integral part of the course and you will be assessed

against the national Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) standards. The final teaching placement will usually occur during the autumn term of the second year.

Assessment

There is a range of assessments built into this course including individual presentations, written assignments, assessed on-line blogs, small-scale research and work-based portfolios. Teaching placements are also assessed against the current national standards for qualified teacher status. All assessments are marked by a range of tutors and you will receive detailed feedback.

Support

Studying at BGU is a student centred experience. Staff and students work together in a friendly and supportive atmosphere as part of an intimate campus


Your future


